



Course waivers at Keller

At DeVry University's Keller Graduate School of Management, your educational and professional experience matter. If you've completed a qualifying bachelor's degree in business or technology, you may be eligible for course waivers applicable to your master's degree program at Keller.

To qualify, you must have completed your qualifying degree within 10 years of your date of application to Keller and must have graduated with a cumulative grade point average of 3.00 or higher. All requests for course waivers¹ are considered on an individual basis.

Read below to learn about course waivers in Keller's master's degree program in Business Administration (MBA), as well as in our other business and technology-focused master's degree programs.

Course waivers – Keller's MBA degree program

Students with bachelor's degrees in business or technology may be granted waivers for **up to 3 courses totaling 9 semester-credit hours**. MBA students awarded these waivers have just 10 courses (30 semester-credit hours) remaining to complete their program.

Note: Students pursuing the MBA without an embedded Leadership graduate certificate may be eligible to waive MIS548 AI Applications for Business in lieu of waiving one of the above courses.

Course waivers – Keller's graduate technology degree programs

Students with bachelor's degrees in technology may be granted waivers for **up to 5 courses totaling 15 semester-credit hours, depending on their program of study**. Students in Keller's master's degree programs in Information Systems Management (MISM), Information Technology Management (MITM) and Network & Communications Management (MNCM) who are awarded these waivers have just 10 courses (30 semester-credit hours) remaining to complete their programs.
